*Liverpool Old Hebrew Congregation*




Liverpool Old Hebrew Congregation was established around 1750 in Cumberland Street, Liverpool. As the community grew, it moved to three other locations around Liverpool and finally in 1874 to Princes Road and this most beautiful synagogue, designed by brothers W & G Audsley. Princes Road is the oldest synagogue in Liverpool.
